**WHEREAS, the Korean War has been referred to as the "forgotten" war and has often been overlooked by historians, as well as the American people; and**

**WHEREAS, June 25, 2011 is the 61st anniversary of the beginning of the Korean War; and**

**WHEREAS, it is fitting that all Floridians honor America's Korean War veterans, through whose service and sacrifice we today enjoy freedom and liberty.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rick Scott, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend greetings and best wishes to all observing June 25, 2011 as *Korean War Remembrance Day*.**
